*Use these questions as discussion starters with your family over dinner or during a devotion time... or use them as items for personal reflection in your devotions or journaling.*

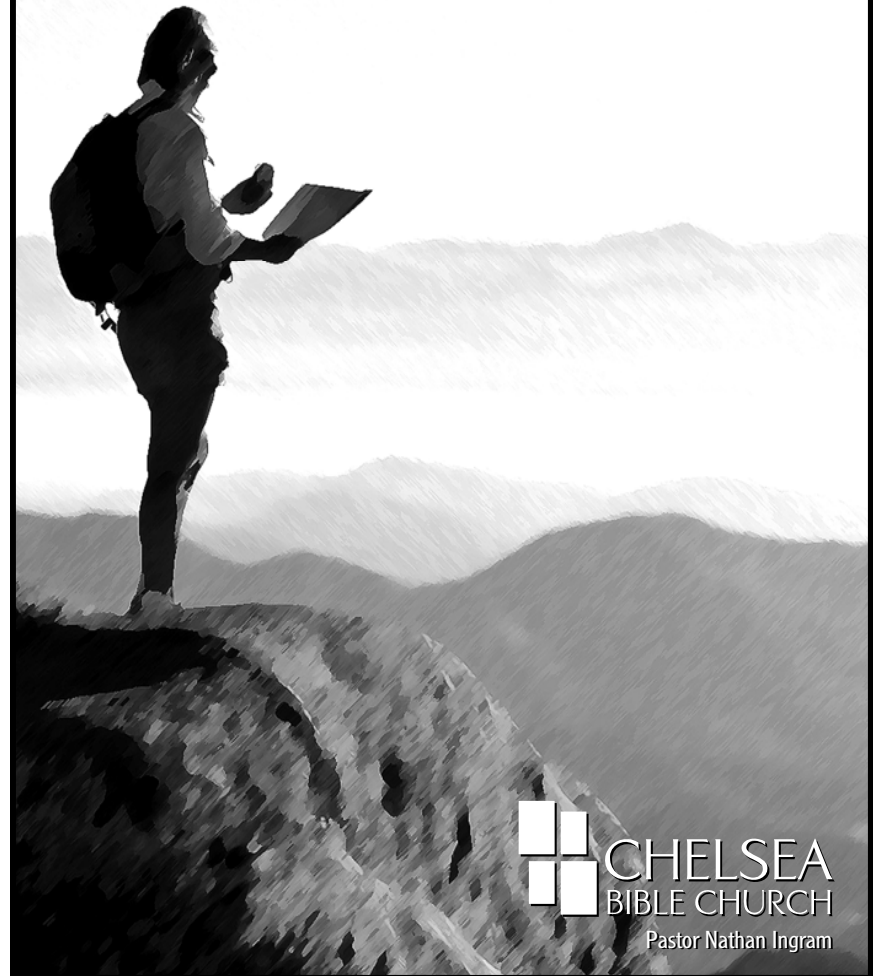
1. What does Rahab promise the spies? What do these actions tell us about her faith? Where do you think her faith began?
2. What do you think about Rahab's lie in verses 4 and 5? Was it justified? Could she have protected the spies without lying? How?
3. Does this story teach "situation ethics" - the idea that lies and other sins can sometimes be condoned to serve a higher purpose? Why or why not?
4. Is there some area of your life where God is calling you to take a lonely, risky stand as Rahab did? Are you prepared to stand?
5. Are you genuinely available to God today? Why or why not?
6. Where does God fit in your levels of commitment? Is He a 1, 2 or 3? What kinds of things seem to make you compromise most often when it comes to God?
7. In what area are you most reluctant to rely on God? Why?

*Take some quiet time to contemplate questions 5-7. The words of the chorus on the inside might be a helpful prayer as you meditate.*

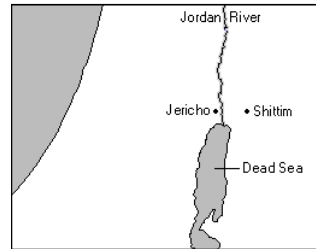
